Uppsala University in a few figures

- Oldest university in Scandinavia, founded in 1477.
- Education/research in 9 faculties: theology, law, arts, languages, social sciences, educational sciences, medicine, pharmacy, science and technology.
- About 40,000 students are enrolled every year, which corresponds to 20,000 full-time students.
- Postgraduate education: 2,000 doctoral students, nearly 400 PhD thesis per year.
- Uppsala University has 6,000 employees, two thirds are teachers and/or researchers.
- Uppsala University offers more than 20 international master programmes and has agreements for student exchange with 500 universities in 50 countries.
- Uppsala University has 3,000 international research partnerships, primarily in Europe, US and Asia.
- 5,000 academic publications per year, 50% articles in international journals.



Historic profiles at Uppsala University

Anders Celsius, Anders Jonas Ångström and Carl von Linné are some of Uppsala University's renowned figures.







Eight Nobel laureates have also made Uppsala University known all over the world... Among them are Manne and Kai Siegbahn (Physics Nobel Price in 1924 and 1981) as well as Dag Hammarskjöld (UN secretary, Peace Nobel Price in 1961).
