



Summary of ILC Promotion Activities

Oshu City ILC Promotion Division (As of April 1st, 2014)

1 Sharing ILC news through Oshu City Official Magazine "Oshu"

The first ILC-related article published in "Oshu" was written in May 2009, about the first lecture to be held in Oshu about the ILC. Since then, "Oshu" has continued to inform the public of upcoming lectures.

After publishing a four page special feature on the ILC in February 2012, "Oshu" started a bimonthly article called "Kibo no Hikari" (Ray of Hope) covering the most recent ILC-related news and city initiatives. The next April, in 2013, "Kibo no Hikari" expanded from a bimonthly to a monthly feature.

"Kibo no Hikari" has featured a summary of ILC plans and a dialogue between the Oshu City Mayor and Atsuto Suzuki, the Director General of KEK. Sometimes there are special features about topics such as Iwate Prefecture ILC Promotion Association's

2 Informing the public through a special ILC website, Facebook and Twitter accounts

On April 10th, 2013, Oshu City started the Oshu International Linear Collider Website to help citizens better understand the ILC and to inform researchers within Japan and overseas about Oshu City's ILC related efforts, as well as about the city itself. The site provides information in English and Japanese including an introduction of Oshu City and an ongoing series of videos called "Oshu for You" with foreign residents showing various fun and interesting aspects of Oshu City. Oshu City continues to cover ILC related news on its official

Facebook and Twitter accounts, and the ILC Promotion Division has recently started an English language Facebook account.

3 Activities of the Oshu City ILC Promotion Association

The Oshu City ILC Promotion Association was formed on July $6^{\rm th}$, 2012 to support the efforts of various groups and organizations to bring the ILC to Tohoku, and to build local enthusiasm by sharing information about ILC plans. After the Association's general meeting on May $16^{\rm th}$, 2013, the mayor and two other participants gave a presentation about their experiences during the observation visit to CERN.




Even though membership in this association is limited to organizations and groups within the city, the number of participating groups has grown from 38 groups at inception to 59 groups as of April 1st, 2014.





Summary & Future

- Dickens: "It was the best of times; it was the worst of times..."
- There is an enormous amount of work and enthusiasm in the northern regions and in many politicians governors and Diet members.
- In MEXT, at the lower levels, there is a debilitating caution and negativity.
- Apparently there will be some sort of interim report from the MEXT working groups at the end of April. This will be a crucial indication of where we are going.
- A Diet members visit to the USA is being planned, possibly also for April. In the meantime there is as yet no agreement to fund ILC work from DoE, despite their assurances they want to



Summary & Future

- As regards Europe, MEXT has no idea what to do. Robert-Jan Smits must leave his current position by the summer. The CERN DG has received a letter from MEXT requesting a further meeting. There will be a meeting of several of us at CERN next month to discuss the way forward.
- One possibility is to host a Diet members visit in 1 or more European states. The work this will require is daunting and which one(s)? I will make enquiries in UK next month.
